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COURSE DESCRIPTION

- This advanced level of undergraduate course aims to introduce the basic concept, global context as well as community development practices.
- After finishing the class participants are expected to come up with two decent learning outputs i.e. :
 - community profile
 - academic paper or project paper

INSTRUCTIONAL GOALS

Competencies to be mastered by all class participants can best be described by a well known UNESCO's four domains of learning, i.e.:

Learning to know; participants are able to understand the basic concept of community development and become aware of how the global context is shaping community development both in theory and practice.

Learning to be; participants are expected to be considerable social beings.

Learning to do; participants are able to do community profiling and to produce academic paper or project paper as determined class outputs..

Learning to live together; participants are able to work together and deliver outputs of designed class project in timely manner as well as to resolve a raising conflict, if occurs.

LEARNING PROCESS

This course primarily employs *student centered* and *experiential learning* process in which students not only become the main actors of learning but also enable them to utilize their own life experiences as sound empirical evidence.

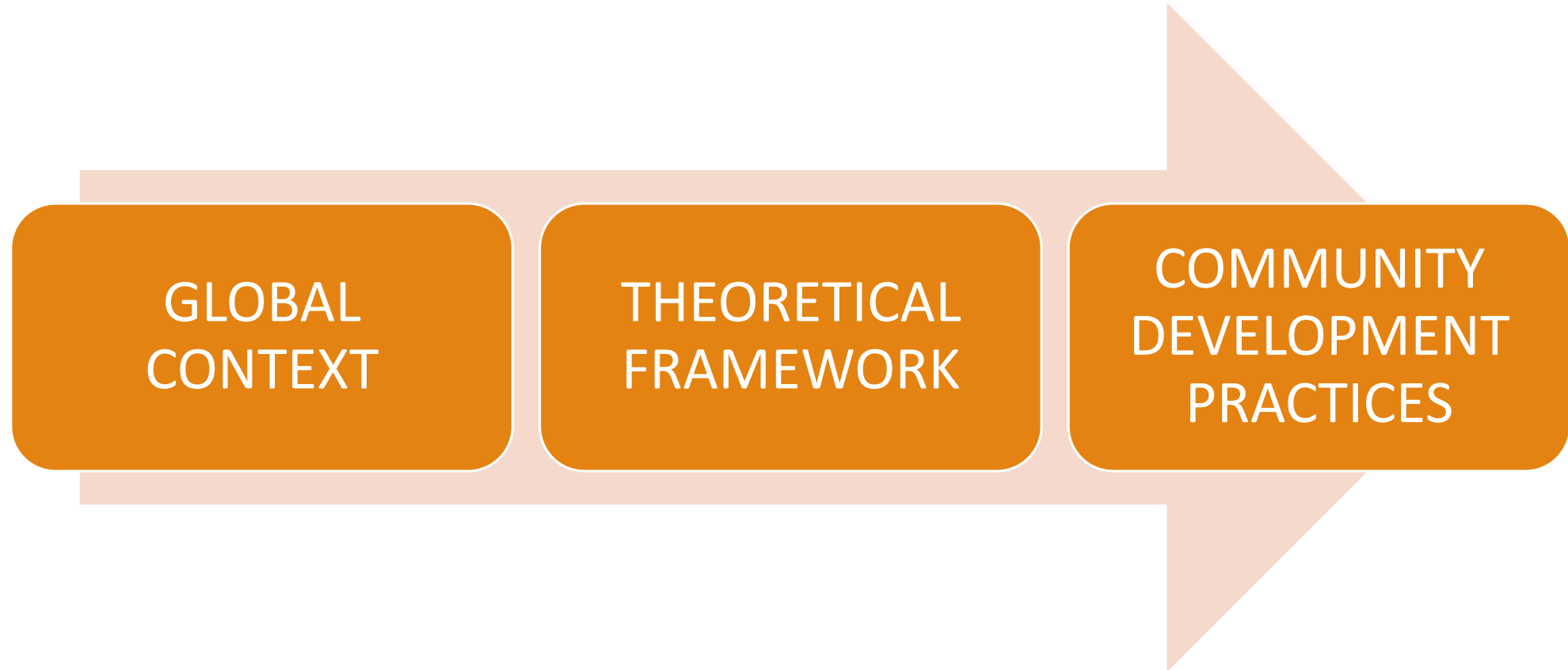
This class enable participants from different cultural backgrounds to develop their best capacity as an individual actor as well as a team player.

EVALUATION SYSTEM

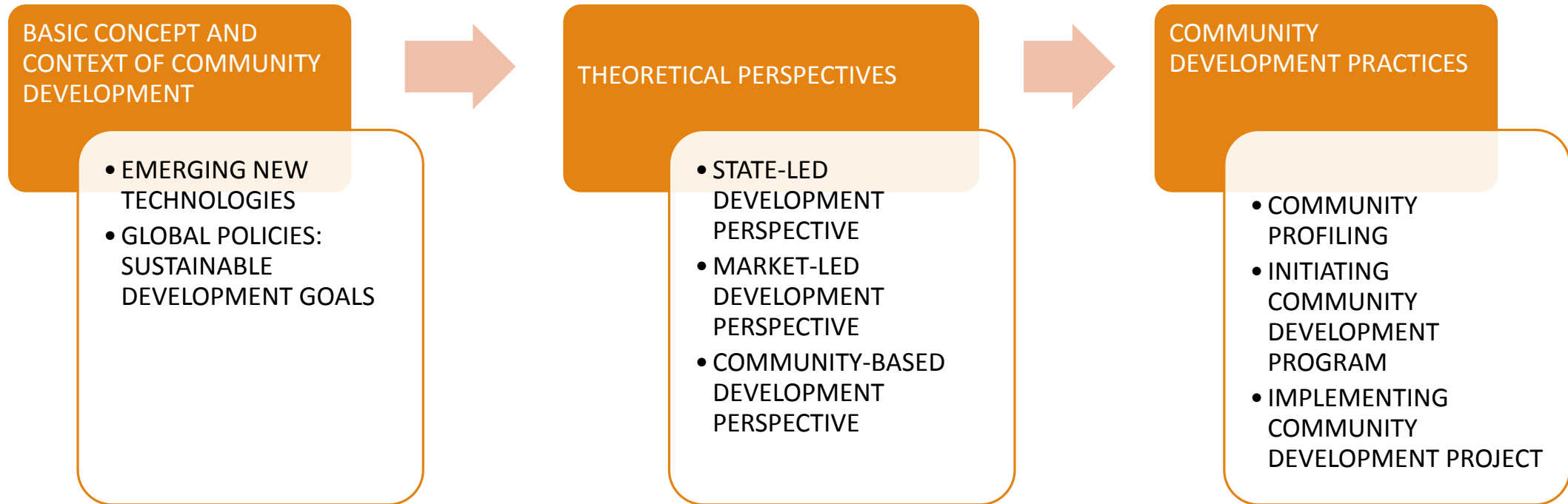
Students will be evaluated and graded using three following means of evaluation which are:
