CLIMATE CHANGE ; A GLOBAL WARNING !

The Earth's climate has changed throughout history. Most of these climate changes are attributed to very small variations in earth's orbit that change the amount of solar energy our planet receives¹. The current warming trend is of particular significance because most of it is extremely likely (greater than 95 percent probability) to be the result of human activity since the mid-20th century and proceeding at a rate that is unprecedented over decades to millennia².

In recent decades, changes in climate have caused impacts on natural and human systems on all continents and across the oceans. Evidence of climate-change impacts is strongest and most comprehensive for natural systems. Some impacts on human systems have also been attributed to climate change, with a major or minor contribution of climate change distinguishable from other influences³.

SOME IMPACTS OF CLIMATE CHANGE ; CAN BE ILLUSTRATED AS FOLLOW⁴

- 01 In many regions, changing precipitation or melting snow and ice are altering hydrological systems, affecting water resources in terms of quantity and quality.
- 02 Many terrestrial, freshwater, and marine species have shifted their geographic ranges, seasonal activities, migration patterns, abundances, and species interactions in response lo ongoing climate change.
- 03 Based on many studies covering a wide range of regions and crops, negative impacts of climate change on crop yields have been more common than positive impacts.
- 04 Impacts from recent climate-related extremes, such as heal waves, droughts, floods, cyclones, and wildfires, reveal significant vulnerability and exposure of some ecosystems and many human systems lo current climate variability.

Those examples show adverse effects of climate change to the communities in the world. Therefore, it is necessary to discuss the notion of climate change in a global context, especially because recently there is also a part of the global community determines that the recent apprehension over climate change is not real.
